This week, John's teaching goes a bit further and explains Jesus' purpose; His specific service and charity! Jesus gives people what we need! He helps human beings succeed in life to fulfil our own purposes. To these thoughts we add some questions for you. Are you inspired to do charitable work? How does this demonstrates that God expects us to provide for peoples needs? Does the belief of providing for people's needs aligns to (Matt. 25:35) For I was hungry and you gave me food...)? Hunger attacks the most valuable people in the world. **When you see a need, do you open your hands and give help to exercise the mind of God?**

Almost every topic John covers, he related them to practical things we can do! Which is an hint of our roles. We are not to just deliver information but humans should be reoriented to give help in real- life crisis. Our behaviors are not up to God's standards. So, ask yourself the following question: **What can I do to undo the human suffering in my face?** Example, for someone who can't move. How should I minister or stop such persons from being completely ruined if he or she is being tormented? Let us pray for God to help us objectively evaluate treatment options for the people lacking understanding of good and evil in our midst?



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Welcome: Who Will Stand Up And Intervene For You? The moment you need it!

Introduction (slides 5-6)

- (John 6:5-9)** let us look at the ethical characteristic, of this young person's action. Jesus asks "Where shall we buy bread so that these people may eat?" **What parallel account of bread in the Torah is tying to John 6? Is this an explanation explaining how we are to treat each other when there are needs? Think about it: a lad choose to give up all of his five loaves and the dingy two fish he owned to feed hungry people. Notice how he is referred to. In the eyes of people's social standing it speaks of a "low rank." Nevertheless he is the one willingly feeds everyone hungry to help stop human starvation. At times it is not the rich who is going to help you. Not the leaders.**
- (Jn 6:18-21)** Imagine that you are in a situation it looks like there is no way out. You are trapped! Worried! Your last storm has been awhile back. You forgotten what it feels like to be caught in a storm. But the minute you allow Jesus to show you how to navigate yourself. His Word gives the solutions you desperately needed. Do you believe that the disciple's miracles could happen in your own life?
 - Without the word of God and the Spirit of God and trusting in Jesus would all of humanity fail?
 - Everything exist because of the Word of God (Jn 1:1). Imagine that? What benefits the people receives by accepting Yeshua (Jesus) on the sinking vessel? Have you experience the power of Jesus (Phil 3:10)? Can Jesus fix your problem?
- (Jn 6:41-42)** Do you call people names like bastard? Illegitimate child? **(Jn 12:24-27)** What is God's purpose for sending Jesus to the earth? "unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains by itself alone; but if it dies it bears much fruit. **Does this describe a type of suffering?** People in Israel knew Yeshua came from Galilee. They understood his humanity. Do you believe they understands how he put the carnal nature of man to death? What responsibility does scriptures tells us is required to be his followers **(Lk 12:27)**? How hard was it for people to understand a new approach to live one's life? Do you believe that pride can prevent us from learning from those we think are not at our level?
 - Behind the statement Son of man—is connected to a new type of human being. They said, he was the son of Joseph; but the people actually witness God's miracles. As such, He displays unique, new characters, and the integrity of the true nature of God.
 - Aren't you unique? Have you become like that new man? Everything he demonstrates is the character of God and God's heart.
- (Jn 6:44)** No one can come to me unless the Father who sent me should draw him. Is this your prayer?
- (John 6:45)** It is written in the Prophets—they shall all be taught of God. Can you find where it is?
- Jn 7:19-20** has not Moses given you the Law? Yet none of you keeps the Law. Why do you seek to kill me. You are demon possessed, the crowd answered. Who is trying to kill you?" (Duet. 32:46; Prov 20:9; Eccl. 7:20; Rom 3:32). Could this be an understanding that if humans are trying to kill one another, we become an accomplice of the devil, even without wanting to do so? Think deeper about that question.
- (Jn 7:24)** Jesus says this is correct way to judge. Judge not the man unless (see **Zach 7:9; Deut. 1:16**) **(John 8:1-18)** You judge by merely human standards. What is God's standard to judge actions? The one without sin among you, let him be first to throw a stone at you (Jn 8:7; Duet. 17:7; Ezek. 16:40)
- John 8:40—see Psalm 15:2-4 You want to kill me, the one who tell you the truth I learned from God. Do you understand what Jesus meant "What you are doing are the works of your father." See Jn 8:41-24.
- Why do you not understand? You are not able to give obedient hearing to my Word (Jh 8:43)

THE MOMENT YOU NEED HELP (JH 6—8:43)



Everything Must Be studied For Its Purpose!

Genesis paints a picture for us to see, how easy it is to be in compliance with the devil. Humans had a choice between to do good or evil, evil would harm themselves. Genesis reveals that humans did not triumph over evil. But rather sits back and allow evil to breakout and harm ourselves **(Gen 1:1-31-3:1-17)**. **(John 6:25)** why do you believe Jesus comment on the people's motives? Why tie one's thinking to faith and the importance of their role or actions toward each other?

- Good is commendable or virtuous **(Gen 1:4)** stresses that in or with God's spirit we can build on **good actions**
- The first recorded death happens by human hands. Not God.
- John 1:1-5-21:1-25** and **(Genesis 1)** Yeshua (Jesus) came to us as Light. Light means a lot of good things. It gives us the broadest knowledge that in Jesus, rich and poor people receive light to overcome evil or darkness. Think about having light at home, it helps you to do your work and fix the problems there. True? Street lights helps you see roads.
- Jesus came as a model for you to see how to have victory over evil. See how to behave and be victorious over evil forces. Not by his own opinion, but agreeing with truth; knowledge, facts, ideas God gave for living life.
- Good comes from God's mouth **(Gen. 1)** meanwhile evil comes from humans mouth (reference Rev. 16:13-21).
- Good and Evil in Genesis came about not as the way to get into heaven. But rather, it identifies unfavorable conditions that develops or is well on the way. Genesis gives us a chance to see we should choose to be united. Do good or sit back; take care of yourself and allow further development of evil, which will potentially harm the whole world.

(Rev 16:13-21) "Unclean spirit come out of the mouth of the dragon and out of the mouth of the beast, and out of the mouth of the false prophet. For they are the spirits of devils, working miracles, which go forth unto the kings of the earth and of the whole world, to gather them to the battle of that great day of God Almighty. **(Notice where Evil is depicted as coming from demons and humans mouth).**

I N T R O D U C T I O N

THIS WEEK'S LESSON JOHN 6:1-40-8:1-59



Fix them don't break anymore of us!

John starts, this chapter (John 6), saying after these things. Yeshua went to the sea of Galilee. Here, he continues to make the point of reasonable things, we can do to improve the life of humans needing help.

Patterns are important. First, what are some "things" in the chapters he has covered? Have you been thinking about such things? Where is the sea of Tiberias? Why mention this specific area? Its significance? He connects the lesson to previous teachings from the Torah. Tying it to people in the wilderness, a piece of land and now his audience. There is a lot more to it. This area is a specific piece of land, place of refuge Moses gave to the children of Israel (**Numbers 11**). What more do we need to learn about it from experiences in the Torah? Look it up. What have we missed?

Should the people's experiences in the book of Numbers help us learn obvious reasons why and how we should respond to people's needs in our own communities? How do you treat your neighbor? Compassionate?

- In the book of (**Numbers 21:31-33, Duet. 3:1-7**) "Og King of Bashan came out to meet us, he and all his fighting people in war...and YHWH our God gave into our hand Og king of Bashan." God caused Israel to inherit the land. At this time Moses, told Israel to hearken to the teachings of God, observe them that you may live. The kings were destroyed in the wars, God fought. This land was given to be a city of refuge, (Golan) one of its city (**Duet. 4: 41-43; Joshua 13:29-31**)
- Many people died, in these battle, and the people rebelling against God unwilling to give others drinking water and food to eat (**Duet. 2:28**).
- The region to the sea of Galilee is known for its war-mongering.**
- Who is the one that is able to produce peace, in the earth?**

Who Will Stand Up And Intervene For You?

Brokenness Through the Torah, Prophet and New Testament, we see great human sufferings.. A lesson we have come to learn that before one's fruitfulness is manifested there seems to be a breaking of the fleshly or strong selfish will that can be in us (1 Cor 3:2-3). In the Brokenness exist an exceptional opportunity. This is shown to the world by your fruitfulness of love, patience, compassion, mercy! Which was poured out of the people's heart below. As examples, of their service and charity to others according to the necessary conditions, needs and works required for renewals.

From in the beginning God tested the past people as does a teacher. He examined their actions like a stern Father. A teacher command us to produce fruit guided by our actions. We need the mind of Jesus. People display faith in God as the Old Testament reported. To teach us how we can withstand terrible things. A loyal attitude of faithfulness to God is the desirable attitude of Jesus. It is said of Moses see (Heb. 11:24-26). He demonstrated nothing is as strong as faithfulness. John points to these important traits. This opens our eyes, and should make us ask the question is there something missing in me?. What does the Bible teaches us is the purpose of trials (**James 1:2-4**)? Unexpected change? Evil is present everywhere. Lies. Something is false, invalids, errors, humans are not succeeding in all areas of our life. Why? How so? What should you do to fix it?

What is so unique about each person below causing them to arise, with fundamental change, enough and a forceful response that stop disorders facing the land?

The primary question is who will you stand up for? **Why did Noah arise?** Who singled out Noah at the time of Divine anger to stand up in righteousness preaching truth to the manner in which God responded to him by leaving a remnant on earth? Who kept Noah blameless and faithful? When God destroyed the land with a great flood. Noah's action made God had to leave a few people on earth (**Genesis 7-8**).

Why did Abraham arise? Human's behaviors displeased God in Sodom and Gomorrah it awoke God's anger. Is it not God's wisdom why Abraham, arise in prayer? Abraham's action made God had to leave a remnant of people in that region. Abraham stood up rising his voice to Heaven for all people, including the ones doing evil (**Genesis 20**).

- Why did Moses arise, obey God and at the word of God withstood terrible kings?** Stopped oppressors, rescued people that were suffering and saved an entire nation of people. Moses and Aaron sacrificed to God on behalf of mankind's sin. Do you understand this? People rejected Moses but when he rescued them they admire him because of the actions he took.
- What allowed Phinehas to stand up and stopped the plague and saved lives?
- Joshua, arise and installed honest judges. Joshua's action cause all these men with human hearts and flawed to implement just laws and justice. Which saved his nation.
- Rahab arise as preserver of life! At the end we will discuss, this prostitute whose action, and obedience to the word of God saved her nation and gave each of us a future full of hope.

Today the world is at a turning point. Will you arise and stop death? How do you know if your action is in compliance with the devil? Who can you help? What is the purpose of your gifts? Someone's life in jeopardy and it is in your power to do good. Will you do good or will you do evil?

THE STRUGGLES FOR TRUTH AND FOOD IN OUR WORLD BEGAN AT CREATION IN GENESIS

- ❑ Genesis marks the start in one's spiritual life of the constant fight to understand truth. Tell us what you think. Adam had Godly wisdom. But how does Adam help Eve?
- ❑ We don't know why he did not help her. Indeed, who can know the intentions of God? When we come to term with the action of Adam. It points out the helplessness of those who have a broad knowledge in a specialized subject area(Gen 2:15-17). How can we overcome this attitude, so other people will not suffer, because of lack of knowledge? Do you believe refusal, to help a person needing your expertise can worsen our problem? Perhaps you have a legitimate reason, you could be attending to your own need. But, by us being too busy, to help those lacking knowledge could impact the world negatively and have long-lasting effect.
- ❑ John draws on lessons to be learned from Genesis. Things that affects the inhabitant of the earth, that limits one's understanding or one's ability and evil thoughts which can penetrate humans causing great confusion, and suffering. An entire generation of people could die because you are too busy, with yourself.
- ❑ In Genesis wanting food shows off human weaknesses. It shows us how being selfish too, can bring destruction to the entire world. How much more Godly wisdom do we need, to have clarity, and choose to unite before making selfish choices? We need to understand that God is the source of everything. No! it is not Satan. He can't give us victory over any of our weaknesses. In John Jesus reiterates the point.
- ❑ We can learn too, wherever there are needs if it is for information, education, physical food, one's safety. The need which you are seeing, implies arrival of a turning point, where decisive change is taking place; between humans on the earth. The situation can be an unfavorable condition that develops or is well on the way. A chaotic situation has appear and humans must make choices.
- ❑ In John chapter 6, by drawing our attention to the picture of "bread" it serves to identify spiritual and physical needs of humanity and bids us to do good. "Your wickedness affects only a man such as you" (Job 35:8).
- ❑ Genesis and John 6, teaches us that God tests our hearts to see what people witnessing crisis or if you are caught up in the chaos will do? Each of the passage expresses something happening, it is disturbing humans; by causing mental discomfort, of varying intensity. Now, we need to demystify what God wants us to do. How are we to help those that are going through trials (2 Cor. 1:3-5)?
- ❑ First the question to ask is, with the unfavorable conditions, you are seeing. What is the action God wants of humans? What are those that are strong to do for weaker humans (Gal. 6:1-5)? **In the book of John, both Jesus and John is demonstrating or teaching, what to do; it is a show-and-tell of the required actions needed.** God wants to see, for Himself; through the situation that God allows. What you will do?
- ❑ Before we learn what to do, take another look at John's life. How did he suffer, because of his concerns for others? What was John's experiences like? Here in this section, of John, the first need we speak of the people are hungry! Had no food to eat. Food is just one need. Jesus steps up to the plate to lead, in giving food to the people. **What is the method Jesus is teaching you for solving the problem? Was Jesus concern over the people's need?** Put yourself in this picture, do you give up everything which is in your hand to help others? Do you give up all your bread to feed a bunch of people you don't know? Or do you try weakening what the Bible teaches that we should do?
- ❑ Given an opportunity, do you say let these people go work, and find food? If you continue in the pathway, or examples, shown in the book of John, you too, will know this suffering and brokenness of heart for the people that are hungry and hurting.
- ❑ Do you enjoy helping other humans that they can feel safe? What can you do for people to help them see that God cares about their troubles? You need to do something specific that stops their pain. The Bible is written for us to learn how to understand the times, to see what will happen in the future to people in the world based upon our actions. It helps us, see what God sees, and show us the steps we can take and protect each other from death.
- ❑ When you see, people suffering. Perhaps their life; is in real danger and they could also die. What will be your behavior or emotional response? Will you do Good? Or be led to do evil?
- ❑ Think! The destruction of the life of humans is a picture the Bible painted for us to see the features and strategy. These are everyday real-life events and some needs that will be increasing very shortly.

Each of us must go through trials and test. You cannot know how to function without God's wisdom. God's Truth—cannot be compared to our learning institutions. (or facts) Ours Is An Education System With Limits

God's Plan (Vision Board) For Your Success

A Teaching Manual! His Instruction (His Word) is the tool which God uses as means of Governing the world, by Facts. (By His Wisdom). But how can we receive wisdom? **How important is it?**

At this point these are few reasons why

1. For your discerning how to navigate life.
2. For you to develop strategy.
3. For you to know what will happen in the future.

Do you know the extent, complexity, intensity or mysteriousness of Good and Evil Knowledge? The whole world lies before God. Nothing can happen, if he does not allow it. God is in control! God ordered everything with clarity. We humans don't.

Here, let us revisit God's instruction when the first humans failed their test. They failed a test and humans began to suffer. Thus, this lesson will discuss God's wisdom and study differences of how John plays his role. First question: What did God say is the purpose of these instructions to Adam?

(Genesis 2:15-17) ADONAI. God took the person and put him in the garden of Eden to cultivate and care for it. 16 ADONAI, gave the person this order: "You may freely eat from the tree in the garden 17 except the tree of the knowledge of good and evil. You are not to eat from it, because on the day that you eat from it will become certain that you will die."

- From what the text shows it was to be their "physical guide." Genesis revealed we have this instruction, as a guidebook in order that mortal man can listen to God, cultivate and care for each other and the earth. Our livelihood and prospect is vast; but reaching one's goal victoriously, will happen if you follow its instruction completely to experience success in life. Did Adam follow God's instructions? Did Eve pass the test? What happen? Did they die? Before Adam and Eve die did God rescue them?
- **Why did God grant them mercy? Or grace to go on living?**
- Why not kill them, He did say they would **die that day**? Didn't he?

About Human Test

We hope that you pay attention! notice how humans understanding is inferior to God's Word (Gen 3:2). God's Word is divine Wisdom—he watches everything under the heaven to the ends of the earth. It was because of human knowledge or understanding that the earth was plunged into suffering. But, thanks be to God, his wisdom save Adam and Eve and pilot them into a new direction. The history of suffering began with human choice of learning.

It was a question. That is it. Addition the intensity of it to Eve and her answer. What was her action? (Gen 3:1-3) Now the serpent was more crafty than any wild animal which ADONAI, God, had made. He said to the woman, "Did God really say, 'You are not to eat from the fruit of any tree in the garden?'" 3 The woman answered the serpent, "We may eat from the fruit of the tree of the garden, but the fruit of the tree in the middle of the garden God said, 'You are neither to eat from it **or touch it, or you will die.**'" What lessons we missed? Did Eve fully understand the department of evil? Or **show us she appreciates God's wisdom?** Could she determine God's total plan for evil?

(Gen 2:15-17) lay out the instructions God had given. Looking at her response. What is missing? Is it facts? Does Eve give the same answer as the information God gave the in (Gen 2:15-17)? Did she lack understanding of the extent, complexity, intensity mysteriousness of good and evil knowledge? Did she know the truth about it? Its implications? Did Eve understands how knowing good and evil knowledge would have destroy the earth? She was told, "certain that you will die."

- ❑ Do you believe she lacks the 'totality' of what is known to God of a specialized area like how evil would affect the earth? A topic? Or the depths of the world? Is Eve in the dark so to speak about measurement of things that are evil? Their distances? Would you concur that there are things that human understanding alone will never be enough to get us over the humps in our life? Of course the bible says, No one knows the totality how the earth functions (SEE Psalm 145:3; Mat 24:36; Eccl. 8:17). Even if you are wise you will not grasp it.
- ❑ God's wisdom is our spiritual food. What can lack of spiritual food do to us? What can not having enough of the "Bread" (of Heaven) do to an individual? Adam and Eve ignored God's instruction. His Wisdom. What happen to them? To us? From having ignored God's wisdom, not only were they kept from receiving what is good but the knowledge destroy them. It has left a testimonial to their foolishness! so the lesson may not be forgotten. It shows human reasoning is misleading. Not on par with God's truth.
- ❑ We all need the Holy Spirit's help to guide us how to function and understand how God uses the things he created. Imagine he sets the bounds for the rain. Measured out the waters. Gave the wind its force. Our job is to follow His instructions. Obey his Word. Trust God.




One boy's action—Is all it took for significant change

What is the thought this objects or picture invokes in your mind? Usually, good actions can occur when we more deeply explore the truth or implications of our decisions. Why do you believe John wanted to share with us that Jesus gave the people bread to eat. He ties it to Exodus God gave people travelling in the wilderness bread to eat. To satisfy their hunger (**Exod. 16:4-21**). Sometimes, we are in situations and we are helped, but later the memory lies hidden, nearly forgotten. True? How many hungry people John says the Lord use the lad's "bread" to serve? What is the purpose of this? What did the lad remembered about hunger? Why gave up his five measly loaves of bread? What was present in his mind? Could the compassion be because of a learned lesson from the Bible about hunger or bread? What if he had not thought about the lessons he learned? Or perhaps his own personal experiences? Can we learn from his behavior? How do you help those that are hungry? Needing service? or charity?

Only God have understanding of the deepness of emotion, feeling and moral character. So look deeper into this passage you will begin to see how John uses different objects to teach us what is present in a person's mind. He use different objects to show that they are instrumental in the liberation of humankind. If, used guided by Godly wisdom. Most importantly, he highlighted this lad's trait! Giving away bread, which is the nature of God, and in the sense its having the mind of Jesus. This feature is contained in us! And gets revealed when used for the goal of helpfulness, God establish at creation. This action, Jesus is waiting to see you display, to your fellowman. Once you are devoted to helping with a specific action, to give charity, God will do the rest. Not much is said about this lad. Except that he went down in the record, hall of fame; for good deeds. His fame went throughout the whole earth. His fame is still spreading today. But life includes some types of suffering, are you prepared to go through trials?

(Jn 6:5-9) the name of this lad is unknown. But he receives recognition for saving the lives of thousands of people; because he willingly use all the bread he had to serve God and save lives. What is the difference and similarities with this lad in John 6, and the first man Adam? What Adam had done made God said to him: You will eat bread by the sweat of your forehead till you return to the dust (**Gen 3:19**) CJB. We all want to be children of God, and wants to be blessed. But struggles. Jesus himself wrestled with his own personal desires in the Garden. What decision did Jesus make (**Jn 18:11**)? Did he submit to God's will? On the other hand, why would the first man reject God's wisdom? Why are some people thoughtful while others are not? Think about it. A lad, whose name is not even mention in scripture change human conditions of hunger with 5 loaves of "bread." The lad's actions had global value.

Help begins with being thoughtful. What do you have in your hand?. What will you do with it? You see, you do not need much to be able to help others. Today we must encourage our children to do more good in the world. Caring, sharing is something we need to do more of. Do you love your neighbors? Show it.



ONE MAN'S ACTION GIVES KNOWLEDGE, INTELLIGENCE AND INSIGHT

Yeshua (Jesus) said, "I am the Bread of life" (**Jn 6:25-35**) Whoever comes to me will never go hungry. **What might be a good reason for John tying his teaching to the Passover? He is connecting the text to Genesis? Tying it to Exodus and bread in the wilderness (Numbers 11:13)?** Though addressed to the people in the Bible. **Why would John mention that the Passover is at hand?** The word of God is man's solid bread. And is identify as a set apart someone or something (**Gen. 14:18; Exod 34:18**). This is very deep! We learn from the word of God, a personal quality, that more definitely sets apart you; for your daily tasks. It helps you advance your life and build up the world. Have you use His Word to discover your gifts? Talents to fulfill your purpose and help someone else live a stable life? By His Words we are warned to not do evil. When we reject His instructions, we fail at our tasks.. Here, Jesus as the representation of God, says, in him is wisdom, the very same wisdom of God that protected the first human. It is God's wisdom, His word delivered Adam from his fault. After humans were rescued God's wisdom gave success to their actions. It is the voice of God, His word, brings things which were unseen, appeared in the world. His Word gives us natural laws to live by.

This type of wisdom is hidden from mankind. "God alone establish wisdom, knowing it in depth" God understands everything in the world "and said to humans: The fear of the Lord is wisdom, avoiding evil is understanding. The Bible teaches God's mercy is shown even when he punished mankind. Things in the world, the depth of their purposes are hidden from us. True? If untrue, how would you explain why one person is kind. While another is not, but is rather spiteful. Why one person willingly go the extra length and act to prevent starvation when others had nothing to eat? Is it how we humans understand and learn speech? If we follow the Bible's explanations it has to do with the thoughts in ones' mind. Eve's life is an example. It shows the human mind is quicker to focus on the negatives or lies in life. On the other hand, Jesus came and his action shows, he exercise the mind of God. Attending to what God wants. Showing like-mindedness in his actions. For our mind to work right Jesus teaches we should agree with the Word of God. Where are examples of how God think? Are they not in the Bible? How do we show those action? Simple, by becoming a doer of good deeds.

The word of God, reveals hidden abilities are in us but are often overlooked. With introspection of yourself, you will find your hidden abilities. Or the feature in you, to use and avoid failures.. We have the ability to stop and think! Do self-analysis, reflect on the good others do to you too. Think about this. Example how you felt. when you had no food to eat for days. Hungry! And your body begins to feel as if it is in chaos, going into shock. You needed food? Right? Were you helped? Who did it? Do you have concern for others? Also, do you believe any human understands the depth or intensity of evil?

1. (John 6:5-9) “Where shall we buy bread so that these people may eat?” What if the lad did not choose to give up all of his five loaves and the small two fish he owned to feed hungry people? Using the term lad points to the ethical characteristic of this lad?

JOHN CONSTRUCTS HIS LESSONS ON GENESIS, NUMBERS AND ON JESUS’ CONCERNS WITH YOUR EVERYDAY NEEDS



Generation through generations people are suffering. But what does the bible says your attitude is to be toward human sufferings? Humans must learn to attend to the needs of each other. John wrote the book name after himself and record specific every day actions that humans can do to save a life. Or stop others from suffering when it is in your power to do so. John draw lessons from the Torah to teach us our sense of duty. What reasons we are told that the people were fed bread in the wilderness (Exodus 16:4-21)? How does John describe these events? What does he tell you to do?

Here is some really important information, Yeshua, (Jesus) uses the bread to demonstrate how to move, audiences, from one step of explaining the process, to the next, which requires action. He reveals that we are to meet the people’s everyday needs, before trying to teach them about God’s goodness. Our actions will gradually illuminate the love of God for them and show the people suffering that God cares about their needs. This implies Jesus teaches the Torah anew, so that we are not to be confused about the goodness of God. (John 6:5-9) “Where shall we buy bread so that these people may eat?” Jesus wants us to see the value in giving people whatever they need to help them be stable. Here are a few facts of the collection of Bible reports about bread. First, think of being hungry and you have nothing to eat. No money. Not even one food shop in sight. What is your mind thinking about? The idea first of all is, (Gen. 1:3-28), which describes that there were no lack. Everything was in abundance! and was very good. Imagine with such great wealth, now the earth has come to were humans are deprived of food? Odd, everything that was in abundance, but by the time the two first people sinned. Bread (or food) was limited. Scarce. The Bible says, once the two first humans introduce the world to evil, God said., “In the sweat of thy face shalt thou eat bread” (Gen. 3:19). A shocker! Staple food was no longer readily available! But rather it must be earned through strenuous means. Do you get it?

At Creation God provides everything for people’s needs. So that they hand nothing to worry about). Mankind had all these treasures, then because of human’s choice, at great personal cost they ignore their responsibility. Thank you for choosing miseries for us. They were assure, (Gen 2:17b), “you will die.” The Bible tells the human actions and actions results; are the cause of, evil to occur. And will occur at unspecified time, in future time. “Death” marks an end of a group of “very good” things, God created that were meant to benefit the world. What you see, in the world is because of human actions, instead of, seeing very good and lengthy progressions, of good, our ultimate fate (death) began to take shape in the earth.

- ❑ What is one reason John takes us back to Genesis? He makes the point that we receives sustenance from the Word of God. Look at the image of “bread,” John is tying it to the word of God which provides us with truth, knowledge, facts, and ideas. It gives clarity on a specific specialized area. We are created in the image of God. The Bible stresses, we are not to hide ourselves from people’s need. It is said in (Isaiah 58:7) “Is it not to deal thy bread to the hungry,” If you have an hear, listen to what the voice of God requires of us. Isaiah 58, is saying, one’s fasting, spiritual life is not as important to God. As you feeding the people who are hungry in your midst. In the book of Job it is written, withholding bread from the hungry is a sin (Job 22:7).
- ❑ The Bible, is given so we learn what will appear or take place in the future. One man’s failure to fulfil responsibilities results in harming the whole world! This is an action since creation. When the first two people sin. Human disorders like hunger, illnesses, lack of truth, nakedness and needing clothing began. These needs comes as test. At the start of Creation human life began with the introduction of spiritual food, “the Word of God” and physical food “livelihood” and **Good** and **Evil**. **But man’s action changed the order of things**. Also, **the bible describe spiritual and physical nourishment as a link to our “test” to reach one’s goal**. Our success, your goal has a direct connection to food. Aside from the basic problems with hunger. Food or bread, is connected to one’s desires spiritual and physical. In addition to good and evil. What (Jere 17:10) says is, the LORD, search the heart, I test the mind, Even to give every man according to his ways. According to the fruit of his doing. That brings me to the understanding that we are tested and rewarded according to the fruit of our doing.

Two primary questions. What did Eve say about knowledge of good and evil (Gen. 3:2)? Compare her answer to the question she was asked with the instruction God gave Adam (Genesis 2:16-17)? Look at them side by side. The world is a classroom! We are tested through study and experience.

A SERIOUS QUESTION TO PHILIP BEFORE SHARING SIMPLE STEPS.

Yeshua has profound knowledge how to handle the situation. When he sees humans, suffering, brokenhearted. But he asks, "Where shall we buy bread so these people may eat (Jn 6:5)?"

- Here is a question for you. Is the way you are thinking about a situation the right approach? Jesus wanted to reveal the manner in which Philip thinks. Behaves and his response in general to a chaotic situation. What should our attitude be? Is it mercy? (Romans 15:2) Each of us should please his neighbor and act for his good, thus building him up. Notice how the passage, in the book of John, is explaining, to you, how to meet a specific, duty or obligation if the need comes up in your midst.
- Is this important? Why did Jesus give us this example? You too, will notice that God is testing your heart. If we follow the idea of God tests one's heart to see for Himself what will we do. Indications are it is your duty to find a solution for the problems right there in your face.
- Think how you can fix it. If you do not have answers go get help. Go ahead with reasonable solutions within a safe space and fix it.
- What steps should we take with the problem in our life? The ones affecting your family; at least suggest where to get the help. It is your duty to try and restore people to a stable condition. Imagine that Jesus asks Philip where shall we buy bread so these people may eat?" You are aware of the method, it is your turn to asks your friends how can we make a whole group of people be restored to a proper working order? What may we do for them? In what ways can we make them feel fully complete before expecting them to keep going any further?
- Wherever you are, today, if a need is presented to you. God is testing you right this minute. How are you responding to the chaos in your life? World?

GOD'S TEST ARE INVALUABLE SO THAT ALL HUMANS CAN LEARN BASIC LESSONS.

Let us take the focus off our self: Sharing in the suffering of others. It gives each sides, you and the other party the opportunity to see the goodness of God, demonstrated through human's hands. When King David cause human sufferings he did something special. He displays open brokenness.

- As we read in the Book of Psalm, King David ask God to test his heart and see if there is any wickedness hidden there. When the king prayed this specific prayer it came about after his own brokenness Where he had several serious missteps when he seriously harm others.
- Cruelty is in all of us. Wickedness!
- What are the circumstances that causes you to be cruel? If we experience cruelty what will happen?
- Can we expect maliciousness? Greediness?
- Covetousness?
- Do you have an awareness when you crossed the line and is doing evil to another human being?
- Do you know how many people in this world would rather dump an item than giving it away?
- Do you know how many person go in the opposite direction away from humans that are needing help?
- How do you expect the world to respond to you in your sufferings?
- Here in the book of John the example of the small amount of Bread, John, and Jesus too, shows that it does not matter how tiny; the amount you have, give God thanks and be grateful for it.
- Be more happy to share, with others from your small amount. You may be the one, God gifted to feed others and make them stay alive.

John 6: 5-9 discussion continues. A young person chose to give up all of his five loaves and tiny two fish he owned to feed hungry people and his good deeds stops thousands of people from being overwhelmed by hunger. Perhaps they would have starved to death from lack of food.

Read the text again and see what Yeshua (Jesus) is teaching us about. (John 6:5-9) Then lifting up his eyes, Jesus saw the crowds that were coming to him, and said to Philip, “Where shall we buy bread so that these people may eat?” He said this to test Philip, for he himself knew what he was going to do. Philip answered him. “Two hundred silver coins would not buy enough bread for each of them to have a piece. Then one of Jesus’ disciples Andrew, Simon Peter’s brother, said, “there is a lad here, which hath five barley loaves and two small fishes; but what are they among so many?”

Despite their immediate needs—the solutions was hidden in Philip’s mind. Why? How so? Was Philip not able to grasp what is needed as a solution to this specific problem? What was he thinking of?

Philip had limitations in the role he needed to play. Why? Is that his emotions at work? Why a solution is of such complexity for him? Is God preventing Philip from finding an answer? The Bible says, God wrote our history, before we were born (Psalms 139). Is it Philip’s role to find the necessary food? Simon said, there is a lad here, which hath five barley loaves and two small fishes; but what are they among so many. How come Simon had an answer? He too is showing signs of doubt. Do you understand the emotion, feeling or moral character of others? No, we do not understand these things. Only God have understanding of the deepness of emotion, feeling and moral character. Only God alone, understands the thoughts of humanity. If you were present would your response be different? If you see this, what will you do? How would you know if you did the right thing? All we know is that God would have already accepted our deeds.

The two responses shows a annoyance. Troubled minds. Whatever task comes your way, do it, with all your strength. What should the young lad action push us to do when we see hungry people? What does this includes? It includes mercy. Thoughtfulness. Ask yourself is this how we need to care for others? How did Jesus respond? People were expecting food, possible braved hostile weather condition to travelled and come to hear Jesus. People were gathering around Jesus for the fulfillment of their needs. It was Jesus the people were looking for. Correct? But others had to help. Therefore, everything that we humans know, along with one’s deeds are in God’s hand.

It is impossible to grasp a good understanding of everything that is happening on earth. Try and imagine lunch time at a Hurricane shelter. People are in a shelter, destruction is all over the land. But all the people there have no food to eat. We know that these are things happening right now. These are real-life chaos. You look up and there in front of your eyes, you, sees someone with some food. What if the person agrees to hand over everything to you? Would you not want to know the person’s name? Would you make space for the individual to be recognized for their good deeds? Would you think that God has miraculously delivered you from your situation? Would you share the food you received?

John takes listeners back to Genesis to reorient our minds about mercy, a simple concept we missed. Pause and think. Who have you made to feel that their contributions are not worth anything? Review how you treat your own children. The neighbor. Are you putting down others? Sends people to go harm themselves? Seeking love in wrong places? Have you been spoken of while doing a good deed and it has left you feeling a bit low in spirit? What should you do? Excuse the behavior? Speak up? Do you speak of others in a manner that makes them feel very insignificant? What line is crossed when we speak of others disparagingly? Should you try to cross it? If I don’t say one hurtful word to you, your feelings cannot be crushed. If my actions are not physically hurtful. You will never ever, be broken. Do you understand this?

How did God shape the world? It was done by his words and action! But because of words and action—Throughout history, God always had to act as protector and a shield to keep us alive. From harmful words and actions. These are what is destroying us; words and actions. God test the heart of humans, as (Jer. 17:10) says “I, the LORD, search the heart, I test the mind, Even to give every man according to his ways. According to the fruit of his doing. In Genesis, the idea God presented is for humans to progress the primary focuses are: when the human heart is tested two or more people should collectively follow His instruction, obey it, and in love make the right decisions and take action by doing what is beneficial to the whole world. By preserving the life of humans.

- ❑ Chapter 1-3 of Genesis God gave the specific pattern, it shows God would allow unfavorable condition, potential chaos to come on the earth. God uses the two first humans. Addition to His instructions as the benchmark of our tests. That first unfavorable condition developed when a serpent agitated Eve. What does the Bible revealed to us? God took a step back and watched the serpent (tested, tormented, troubled) Eve. What lessons have we learn? Both persons failed to do right by each other. How so?
- ❑ Their action gives rise to, and generate other evil thoughts and more evil actions. It is Mankind, not God that chose to established a chain of evils in the earth.

What is the
required
action?

Now let us review Adam and Eve steps. They had the word of God, put in their mind by God. But because of unbelief began suffering. What does that teaches you to do about the word of God? Anything can happen to anyone. Same thing that happens to a righteous person can happen to a wicked individual. What does the book of James says is the reason of trials and testing of your faith (James 1:2-4)?

The Bible has revealed God could allow, a spirit being, an angel to be agitating a person in your face. That test could be to the wise or a foolish person. Let us see what God wants. What would be the necessary actions God wants to see us do to stop brokenness? Or suffering? Irrespective of whether angels, humans or other entity is causing the tyranny? What does God wants to extract from you or pull out of us witnesses of the trials? Do you agree? Jesus was willing and obedient to help people who were tormented (Matt 4:24)? Isn't this a natural picture teaching us how to help others.

Read Matt 4:24) What do you observe about Jesus' action? One answer is "And his fame went throughout all Syria, and people brought to him all sick people that were taken with divers diseases and **torments** and those which were **possessed with devils** and those which were lunatic, and those that had the palsy, **and he healed them.**"

Do you see any evil? can you describe the evil? Do you stay silent? What evil are you doing? Are you questioning, why humans work hard and cannot be satisfied? Why so much grief? The suffering, is meant to extract mercy? That is it. God is giving you a chance to be His hand extended in the earth. Do you know anyone that is cast down but unconquered?

Constant evil is not God's concept, but do you observe how it is active today?

Having seen a picture of how Adam and Eve participated and watch evil developed. When will we arise? Unite to stop evil from breaking our spirit?

Evil could come on earth as: An angel? Demon? Human? A bad storm?

2. (Jn 6:18-21) Imagine being in a situation which looks like there is no way out. You are trapped and worried nearly forgotten what it feels like to be caught in a storm. But the minute you allow Jesus to show you how to navigate yourself. His Word helps you find the solutions you desperately needed? A). Without the word of God and the Spirit of God and trusting in Jesus you can do nothing but failed. B). The whole universe exist because of the Word of God (John 1:1). Imagine that? C). Humans were the ones that benefited from accepting Jesus on their sinking vessel. If you are having problem but refuse to accept him into your life to show you how to change the situation. Can you fix it?

(John 6:18-21) And the sea arose by reason of a great wind that blew, So when they had rowed about five twenty or thirty furlongs, they see Jesus walking on the sea, and drawing nigh unto the ship: and they were afraid, But he saith unto them, **It is I; be not afraid.** Then they willingly received him into the ship; and immediately the ship was at the land whither they went.

(REFLECTIVE QUESTIONS—IMAGINE THAT YOU ARE IN A SITUATION AND EVERYONE IS AFRAID)

1. Apart from revealing the simple ways Jesus uses natural objects to improve the life of those who were suffering. It teaches us the actions required for serving others.
2. It shows that God sent Jesus to teach us, that he allows human actions, as part of His miracles. We ought to participate in the work, first, agree with the instruction, to allow the Life Giver's help for our mental discomfort of varying intensity. The scriptures tells us "they willingly received him into the ship, and immediately the ship was at land.
3. Imagine the sight of something or someone that shows ruthlessness. A brutal person. Here the passage describes a dangerous storm. It could be an earthquake. Things as these makes everyone wants to flee in terror. Correct? This picture depicts that fear is a natural reaction to the unknown. Hopefully, true to some degree, for you. But isn't the Bible telling us fear not repeatedly? Why is it so important, that God wants us to be fearless in the face of troubles? The bible repeats it over and over again in scriptures. Explain why?
4. Explain two things that should freak us out! Are you freaked out and afraid to sin? Afraid of doing evil to other people? What is the impact of sin?
5. They were with Jesus, the most powerful person on earth, And fear filled their minds. If God's Word fill your mind, do you fear things that are uncontrollable? Run away from it? Do you invite Jesus into the situations to help you stand firm? Do you ask for help? There are things we should fear. And ones we shouldn't.
6. What drives you to be afraid? Can a branch of tree do anything of itself (see John 15:4)? Brave, courageous, valiant are words the Bible uses to describe fearless humans. Brave implies self-control and resolve in the face of danger. Example, think of a brave soldier. When in danger, do you think, fear is display? Although he does not display fear, do you think he has concerns? Self-control is a fruit of the spirit, given to the children of God.
7. The primary question is, do you fear God? You, have the gift of intelligence. Yes? (Duet. 6:13) tells us, "Thou shalt fear the LORD thy God, and serve him, and shall swear by his name." The word fear here, should be translated as awe. Meaning that we should hold, our God in awe. Afterall, he gives us food to eat and be satisfied, houses, health. Most humans fear the unknown, things uncontrollable. Isn't that the reverse of what we should do? Why then do most people not fear God, be fearful of disobeying God's commands. Do you? If you agree with the scriptures, and believe God is in control of everything that exists. God is the only unknown in the whole world. Why are we not afraid to sin before God? Why do we not have the strength to stand up for what is right and true? We should not be having the troubles you are seeing in the world. Mostly they are because of man-made tradition. On the other hand, the Word of God is wisdom for you, understanding for you, in the eyes of the peoples (Duet 4:7). Duet 6, teaches us, "hear my words that they may learn to hold me in awe all the days that they are alive on the soil, and their children, they are to teach!
8. Are you a reformer for truth? Teacher of the Word of God? Hold God in awe? What are some things we need to do to have God thoughts (Heb 11:6)?

3. (Jn 6:41-44) And they said this man is the son of Joseph. a). Behind the statement Son of man—is connected to a new type of human being, although they said, he was the son of Joseph, the people actually witness God’s miracles, as such, Jesus displays new characters, and the integrity of the true nature of God. b) Jesus adapted God’s mannerism. And displays new characters. God send Jesus to us as man in the flesh. Why not take up or mimic Jesus’ attitude? Scriptures tells us that we ought to use Jesus’ attitude as using it as one’s own personal behavior. b) Have you become like that new man? Do you know everything he demonstrates is the character of God? God’s heart? A new approach to live one’s life? What happen to Moses also happen to Jesus. People ate bread in the wilderness and then rebelled against their leader.

Hebrew Bible: (John 6:41-42) Therefore those of Yehudah were murmuring about Rebbe, Melech HaMoshiach, be he said, Ani Hu [SHEMOT 3:14] the lechem having come down out of Shomayim [SHEMOT 16:4) And they were saying, is this man not Yehoshua Ben Yosef [Ben Dovid], and do we no know his Av and his Em? Now how does he say, Out of Shomayim I have come down Yochanan 1:1; 14”

KJV (John 6:42) “The Jews then murmured at him, because he said, I am the bread which came down from heaven. And they said, Is not this Jesus, the son of Joseph, whose father and mother we know? How is it then that he saith, I came down from heaven?”

IMAGINE WHAT Only Just One Human Being With A Heart Full Of Love Can do To Save The Whole Human Race?

Think! The death of Jesus on a stake is suffering on behalf of others. Was it not so? He came down from heaven on a journey to die, for humans that rejects the truth. Contrast his actions to beliefs in the world today. Do you know that people would rather protect every inch of their space and ideology. Than lift a finger to protect Jesus. Or to protect John from those wanting to harm them. How different are we today? Imagine! Why would the Roman authority choose their laws and tradition over saving a life? Let us compare their actions to God’s action when Adam and Eve broke God’s divine laws. Did God murder them? Didn’t they not die a natural death? Can you think of one reason why the leaders should not have shown mercy to Jesus? Or to John? Notwithstanding, it took only one lad to give up his food to save thousand of lives. The single action Jesus expects from us when he says greater works shall we do. Is for you and I doing good. Saving the lives of upward to twice the amount of people that he served in the very short time he spent with us. Wasn’t Jesus here for only 33 years?

An Amazing Gift

- ❑ John was used by God to introduce Jesus to a people who were feeling excluded from God. The crowd of witnesses listening to John was all kinds of people (prostitutes, tax collectors, sick people, sinners). God sent Jesus down to teach us about spiritual and physical truth. What was Jesus’ experience in (Jn 6:41-42)? How does the false reasoning in John 6, compare with Eve’s? Go to the book Jeremiah, read Jeremiah’s own words of the ways he suffered because of the sins of his people (Lam 3:48-49).
- ❑ Eve wished for knowledge of good and evil. Despite an eagerness for learning; instead of receiving understanding of every facet of good and evil. What happen? The testing of her faith, the trials and suffering provides a picture of miseries to come. When mankind involve one’s self unprotected in the affairs of God. How much do you learn from her test of the trustworthiness of God? Perhaps you are interested in finding out more about evil. Evil is harming humanity. **Its knowledge is being used for killing us. Evil consists of threats beyond our control. Eve’s action reveals that humans do not have clarity; about knowledge of evil and the spirit realm**
- ❑ Where would she find the wisdom she needed? In order to gain knowledge and understanding of our world we need someone with historical data. Is that true? Yes. Historical data give us a better understanding; whether through what they have seen and understands, reasoning or science. Correct? Yes. (See Exodus 31:6).
- ❑ (John 6:42) I am the bread that came down from heaven. Two primary questions. The first is how can you know to identify an item as bread unless its labeled_____? The items always need a label. Reasoning helps you know an object or material. Testing the different layers. Or, God makes the object known to you! It is that simple.
- ❑ Do you know Bread is one of the first food humans produced? In the Bible we are told people of the first centuries use wood to make coal and baked bread. And to warm one’s self on (see Exodus and Isaiah 44). The next question is: Who instructed humans of the ingredients to make bread?
- ❑ Why use the image of bread from Heaven as Jesus coming down to feed hungry humans? This object or image of bread shows, that they have known about bread. But needed to learn the true depth of God’s provisions. He teaches them to go deeper in our heart, think about my compassion and the depth of my feeling towards you. I am the bread that comes down from heaven to feed you. I have more power than natural bread to keep you satisfied! Having a relationship with me you can never be hungry or lack energy to do your tasks. I am always at the right place, right time. Do you know fire used to bake bread in the wilderness kept wild animals at bay_____? Bread provided people with comfort and fire keeps them warm. Do you know that the fire represents the Holy Spirit? Your Comforter!

DIFFERENCES AND SIMILARITIES

Notice Jesus Makes A Definitive Statement About Where He Came Down From

- His character is different from other humans. However, we have his personality. Jesus suffers on behalf of others. Jesus lamented greatly over people's suffering. In his approach to scriptures. He adopted God's mannerism! The ones we read about in Genesis 1, when the world was created at creation. The Bible tell us that the earth was unformed, empty and in chaos. Hence, God created for all the necessities we would need. God is strong, full of power. -He demonstrates what the stronger one, is to do for the weaker person. To the world the bible gives proof that Adam the stronger one, fail to care for Eve. It was God's plan to raise people up from suffering and give them freedom to reset and fulfil their destinies. Jesus' actions is exactly according to the way the Word of God is written for us to do (John 5:36). And the purposes! When he was confronted by humans about healing a person, he responds by saying He was working because His Father was working (John 5:16). In you are those rare gifts to be like Jesus.
- Jesus disregard the methodology and practice of man's tradition and kept to the understanding and truth of scriptures. This behavior in Jesus was something new, strange, for the first time people saw a real human being who is like God. Despite the oppositions, and experiences he did a lot of good.

Three answers as to why (we are the image of God, aren't we?) that is all there is to it.

1. In Genesis, God spoke and by His Word we receive creation
2. God spoke, and He gives a blessing to all of humanity
3. God Spoke, use His hand to work, a physical image of God's people appeared and life begun on earth...full of gladness and love and multiplications.

What are your experiences? People are like sheep, we need a shepherd. Jesus said so (Mark 6:31).

Without God, how would we distinguish what is true or not? Jesus says He is like His Father those who love the truth recognize those speaking the truth. The people he serves he fellowship in their suffering and helped them overcome.

- People around us are struggling for food and if they don't have it, they will die. Do you comfort them? Feed them?
- But beyond eating and drinking there is something else those hungry people need. Is it training? They needed great teachers willing to go where the people are in their place of suffering, pain, sicknesses and train them! And teach truth how to arise, lift themselves up from the ashes.

Although Jesus was the leader that God sent to show mankind how to live. It was difficult for the people to follow him because of their traditions.

How could Jesus' listeners believe that he the son of Joseph had come from God? Could their experiences help them? When Jesus spoke of bread, was he only explaining the inner fillings? The outer surface of bread? The quality of bread? Its purpose? Was he giving wisdom? Did he describe a place above the surface of the earth that no man has gone to? Why did he give historical record? How did the information help the learners? (Exod. 16:14-16), explains that a small round thing lay on the ground. And when the children of Israel saw it they knew not what it was. And Moses said to them, "This is bread which the LORD hath given you to eat." How do we know what bread is? God describes the natural bread. But Jesus was the one sent to give us true wisdom, of who God is. All life is flowing through God. We need to learn who God is.

How would Moses know that the small thing is bread? Who told him what to do with it? God did it.

Jesus is the one sent by God to bring the Good News to humans (John 3:16-17). People were experiencing with him what really happens to people in anguish. The experiences helps us to see how to be just like him: Heal the poor and afflicted (Isa. 61:1). On leaving the earth Jesus sends forth disciples and authorizes them with signs of the Holy Spirit to awaken us to the task we should carry on doing until Jesus' second return.

4. (Jn 6:44) No one can come to me unless the Father who sent me should draw him. Do you pray every day for God to draw people to Jesus? Think seriously of this question. What purpose would you like to see people you pray for be drawn to Jesus?

PATTERNS

When Jesus identify himself as the Son of God here are two explanations he provided:

1. Everything My Father does, the Son does too and everything that the Father has, I have.
2. I cannot do anything by myself.

First, Jesus is teaching us that he is the model for the Sons and Daughters of God. We see throughout the scripture that God uses natural pictures or life experiences to give us examples of what a thing is, was or to come to be.

Have you found one human being has yet who goes toe-to-toe with an opponent, tackle issues head on, by only drawing attention to God? God often uses the term send, showing that he directs a person to a particular place, person or profession for His reason and to fulfil God’s specific purpose! Sometime it is to bring healing. To fix a particular situation or conditions; shape it the best way that will bring forth an abundant good. Or, reveal truth and bring about good for the future generations.


- Here in the book of John, Jesus was sent. But he shows us that how to depend on God (see 2 Cor. 3:4-6). You claim your rights and position, as servant (see Matt. 20:20-28). What did Jesus do when he sees people going through persecution? He uses natural product to give rise to new and a better life. By obeying God, Jesus ministers to anyone caught up in suffering.
- The bible introduced Jesus to us as someone God sent or appointed for a specific mission. Endowing him with the necessary authority to save the human race. He was here helping people rise up, from their suffering or brokenness. He was clear and direct with the people he spoke to.
- Almost everywhere the name Jesus is in the scriptures it relates to him as savior.
- Another example of what God does was to send angels on or upon places or things for a specified purpose. At times to bring deliverance from bondage, which attracts much witnesses and is widespread and often favorable for humans.

STUDY THE LAW OF BEING SENT TO KNOW WHAT IT IS. AND WHY IT IS SO.

Here, a purpose of being sent, the book of Acts reads, “So they, being sent forth by the Holy Ghost, departed unto Seleucia; and from thence they sailed to Cyprus. —Indicating a specified event and the action taken, to send out, or away from one location to a new place. Think of this question: Why did God bring Israel out of Egypt and into the wilderness? He brought them out in order that they might receive the promise land and rest with God, because of an oath (promise God made with Abraham, Isaac and Jacob). God did not plan for them to be wandering and suffering in the wilderness that happen; because of their unbelief (see 1 Cor. 10:11).

How many things are you trying to do by yourself that God did not authorized you to do_____?

Throughout the Bible the Word of God describes what is beneficial or not. It teaches us what successful outcome is. Stop! Ask yourself this question, what has God send you to Jesus for? Is it just for him to save your life? What is it that you need to do for the world? Tell us, what you are going to do. We would like to hear it from your own mouth_____



5. (John 6:45) It is written in the Prophets—they shall all be taught of God.

Where do you go to learn? Who is your teacher? How do you get your mind sharpened? Half fill or a filled mind?

- FIRST:** For whatsoever things were written aforetime were written for our learning, that we through patience and comfort of the scriptures might have hope (Romans 15:4) This describes a teacher who is patient and comforting toward learners or students.
- SECOND:** When I left for Macedonia, I urged you to remain in Ephesus, to warn certain persons not to teach false doctrine (Tim 1:3)
- THIRD:** Regarding mutual love, you do not need anyone to write to you, because God himself, taught you how to love one another

REFLECTION: In the book of Isaiah 54:13; God promised that our children will all be taught by Him. And great shall be their peace. That means the word of God shall get results in one's life. His word will furnish you with the tool and resources for your successes. You are that special person that God loves. He is your teacher. The scripture call us to pay attention and learn from God. He lays the foundation in (Gen. 1). **Think about** public schools; learning is a continued reading, writing, revisions over and over. Going over the same materials until learners grasps the concepts. Correct? It also means, we listened to another person using a manual for teaching us by speaking (Gen 27:6). Yes? Most importantly, a great teacher makes all the difference to help you learn and maintain good grades. Correct? But it is up to you. No amount of teaching can make anyone learn without the person be willing to listen and follow instructions. Correct? Let us remember the people of Israel was not willing to listen to Ezekiel (Eze. 3:7). As a result of this; they learned nothing. What happened? They suffered....). Likewise, even though God is teaching us his word, no amount of materials will help us to learn and practice what we learn. **What should we do?** Unless we are interested in the instructions and pay enough attention. Also to willingly go over and over the materials time and time again, until we understand what it requires us to do. Do you agree?

When we learn enough at pre-K it is to be promoted. Only then the classroom teachers promotes us. Yes? Or no? Many people do not want to learn to think like Jesus. To be able to do what Jesus does. We all fall into that category. That is one reason John sent his disciple in the earlier passages to follow Jesus and sit at his feet to learn anything they need to know about God, from Jesus.

Our challenges, our problems, the bible is full of examples that people don't do what they hear, they do what they see

Here are three things the book of James teaches us to do when we are in trials (James 1:19).

1. Be quick to hear.
2. slow to speak
3. slow to wrath.

The ministry Jesus shows us is one full of love for God (John 14:12). Jesus presented us to God and ask Him to protect us by the name God gave Him. And to keep us fruitful in love, loving each other as the Father loves Jesus and Jesus loves the Father. God is full of love. A God that we still should love even under suffering. He reveals Himself to the world as a Provider. God is Divine provider throughout the earth. Fancy, the very breath in our nostril is like a puff of smoke. A split moment humans loose it and is gone. Man's life passes like a shadow. So enjoy your life be happy ask God to give you wisdom and help you to think like Jesus and not be misled. Ask God to not hide the truth from you, so that you may walk in love and seek God with all your hearts to find stability in life (Eph 3:16-19). "I pray that out of his glorious riches he may strengthen you with power through His Spirit in your inner being."

7. How does Jesus explain the correct way to judge (Jn 7:24) Torah judges not the man unless (see Deut. 1:16)



The format and background:

- Jesus' own brothers could not believe that He is the Heavenly scholar God sent as Teacher to humankind. He was rejected by the authorities. (John 7:24) Judge not according to the appearance, but judge righteous judgment.
- The Torah teaches. (Deut. 1:16) And I charged your judges at that time, saying, Hear the causes between your brethren, and judge righteously between every man and his brother, and the stranger that is with him.
- (1 Sam 16: 7) But the LORD said unto Samuel, Look not on his countenance, or on the height of his stature; because I have refused him: for the LORD seeth not as man seeth; for man looketh on the outward appearance, but the LORD looketh at the heart.
- (Zach 7:9) Thus speaketh the Lord of hosts, saying "Execute true judgment and shew mercy and compassions every man to his brother.

A judge is a person empowered to make decisions that determines points or the issues. The persons God gives authority to judge or make decisions literally is because you have authority or knowledge specifically recognized as authoritative. Judgement literally is your actions which should show concern and sympathy for others. This is a curious and misrepresented action by humans today. Where we have learned to scrutinized others in their absence. We compare them to our standards. Equate and examine our own people behind their backs. That is not what God tells us to do. The standard we use is hearsay. Gossiping. To begin the bible says, "With the measure you measure others you will be measured. We cannot see a person's heart. And we fail to do introspection and recognize truth apart from the thoughts in one's own mind. You really do not know what the truth is. Furthermore the Bible teaches that a judgment on someone else is also a judgment on your own self. In other words, do not be a nitpicker.

Reflective Questions

Human careless appetites to be judges against one's own sister or brother especially of the communities of faith

- First pattern—the bible paints a picture that you need to be sensitive. This a now word; particularly the case in our community. Do you think that you are appointed by God to make determination of people's action? Do you investigate and report on their loyalty to God? While you are assessing them do you have animosity toward them? As you describe their natures how does that match up with your own weaknesses? Do you properly discern and sort things out without hurting others? Do you sift? Separate? Make others feel like nothing?
- Second pattern is, a judge, is set up to judge or review the facts of a dispute and then take the time to distinguish and inform the guilty human apart from the innocent one. Old Testament covers the standards how to judge fairly. But right now do we do evil to each other and kill characters; kill the innocent all in the name of judging?
- Is God using you to judge someone? Your neighbor? Your nation? Next time you are dragged into a conversation to discuss someone. Do not judge according to hearsay. Remember, do not forget the LORD has given you authority over your own body. To rule what you allow others to speak in your presence. What are you willingly listening to? Truth? Or lies?
- Certainly, God has given you authority to judge your brother or sister, but God has a standard.
- Judge righteously! Make sure the persons that you are judging is present to hear the case.
- Most importantly, you should practice true judgment which includes mercy.

8. (John 8:1-18) You judge by merely human standards. What is God's standard to judge actions?



In earlier passages humans were seeking Jesus for the sole purpose of condemning him to death. The people have been speaking or otherwise acting in confusion about the Word of God. Here in John 8, a woman is brought to Jesus to make a determination about her case and explain the law when compared to the report of her action. Those people who brought the report actions adds to the confusing or baffling thoughts people are grappling with to understand how to implement some of the laws taught to them from the laws of Moses. What did Jesus do?

(John 8:1-5) Jesus went unto the mount of Olives. And early in the morning he came again into the temple, and all the people came unto him; and he sat down, and taught them. And the scribes and Pharisees brought unto him a woman taken in adultery; and when they had set her in the midst, They say unto him, Master, this woman was taken in adultery, in the very act. Now Moses in the law commanded us, that such should be stoned: but what sayest thou?

(Duet 22:22) If a man be found lying with a woman married to a husband, then they shall both of them die, both the man that lay with the woman, and the woman: so shalt thou put away evil from Israel.

(Lev 20:10) The adulterer and the adulteress shall surely be put to death.

CONFLICT WITH DIFFERENT WORLDVIEWS WHAT IS JESUS' RESPONSE? DID HE INVESTIGATE THE REPORT? HOW SHOULD WE JUDGE EACH OTHER?

1. An argument was presented to Jesus for him to judge. The lesson here, is that we should love people; not murder them. What Jesus had to say, was different from all the leaders in Israel. The one of you who is without sin, let him be the first to throw a stone at her (**Jn 8:7**)
2. On hearing this they began to leave, one by one, the older ones first, until he was left alone, with the woman still there. Standing up Yeshua said to her, "Where are they?" Has no one condemn you. She said "No sir." Yeshua said, "Neither do I condemn you. Now go and don't sin any more. (**John 8:9**). **Jesus was teaching them how to show mercy and equipping them how to be a good leader.**
3. Yeshua spoke to them again" "I am the light of the world; whoever follows me will never walk in darkness but will have the light which give life. (**Jn 8:12**). Darkness or evil thoughts towards one another is why we commit murder. Tear down and ruin each others destinies.
4. Yeshua said, "You judge by merely human standards." As for me I pass judgment on no one, but if I were indeed to pass judgment, my judgment would be valid; because it is not I alone who judge, but I and the One who sent me (**John 8:15-16**). **This action is what set apart a person and allow an individual to 'judge actions' and be able to act on God's behalf. You don't judge people because you feel like it.**
5. Why bring one person to be judged, investigated a case; without all parties that are involved being present? Human biases perhaps?
6. Is the testimony valid? By what standard do you judge? The word judge means you are entrusted with a specific task to give justice to a brother or sister. This passage shows how crowds of people pursue or hunt for the life of a human being just to punish one individual: While the witnesses are willing to let others just as guilty walk free. What does Jesus wants us to do?
7. Jesus gave us the nature, qualities or behaviors of people involved. Were these honest witnesses? Did they judge using the principles God taught? What did the people do that is wrong? Does this reveal the potential of witnesses to do evil rather than good? Why are we inclined to let the guilty person go free but capture: bring to judgment and persecute one but let the other go free without rational reasoning? Look at their request. Notice that they ask for the fullness of the law to be directed to the one they want to make an example of. Adonai judge by looking at the heart (1 Sam 16:17). But God does not take bribes. Only God knows the intent behind all human actions good or evil.

HOW TO EXECUTE JUDGMENT

 **(Zach 7:9) “Execute true judgment and shew mercy and compassions every man to his brother.”**

- ❑ Never estimate the power of wrong judgement. It destroys life. It kills many innocent humans. No one needs to explain this to us. Look around at the many graves filled with human bodies. Therefore, submit to God’s values. Stay faithful to His instructions. If we continue to believe that what we say does not matter. What we do; does not matter. That what happens to men and women across the world does not matter. Then ask yourself, what controls the destiny of the land? If we can be unjust and bias harming the people, we do not like, meanwhile; allowing the ones we like to commit crimes. If we respond to conflict; thinking what we do to hurt human beings does not matter. Then, as long as the evil behaviors are acceptable. We humans are headed into a very dark area. One that no human being will be able to withstand.
- ❑ Accomplishing change begins with one’s heart. That is where change first occurs, then it will become public. Change is not just modifying one’s behavior, it is a transformation of one’s thinking. We need to hit the pause button. Pause and think. To be able and recognize unhealthy behavior in our own life and be committed to fixing it. By praying to God for help. Identify the harmful action and turn away from it. This takes time, effort, determination and honest support of others; until we show fruitfulness. The Bible highlights human behaviors to draw our attention that in everything we do, we need to show mercy, compassion.
- ❑ The attributes mercy and compassion describes who God is. A person or people who mimics God is in good spirits or behavior, that will lead to good actions. Additionally Yeshua recommends along with your action of being forgiving; you should give the guilty person some degree of counseling that benefits him or her, the advice should work in their favor; rather than to be quick to be harming them.

Personal renewal starts with inward changes. All behaviors in the book of John points to human action that are making other people relatively low. Lower than what we were created to be. The woman was dragged in the public square to be disgraced. Notice, Jesus did not use the opportunity to draw attention to himself. He had no need to impress others of his knowledge. But he says that the standards we use to handle the situation is merely human standards. Here Yeshua indicates that compliance is expected. If we want to see real progress, see healing and people prospering. Then do the right thing. The Law forbids robbery but we allow it if it benefits us. The law prohibits discrimination but we practice it.

When will we cease doing evil to one another?

From reading God’s manual; we don’t really discover any human being; who was masterful, at knowing what to adequately do when serving other people. Go back and take a look at King Saul’s life. When David defeated the unconquerable giant Goliath. What made Saul want to kill David? Saul was a king, well trained soldier; but he coward in fear of a Giant. On the other hand, why when a boy killed the Giant; Saul wanted to murder the young man David? We all need Godly wisdom and help to consciously understand and do what one’s rational mind do not understand. Or wants to do. Think about what Paul observes over and over in his own life. He does not do the good he wants to do but rather keeps doing the evil what he does not want to do. It is sad so many people cannot bring ourselves to a place where we are disgusted with wickedness. We must stop hearing but never understanding, keep seeing but never perceiving because our heart is dull. Those who have ears hear what the word of God requires of you.

Let these words, stimulate you to: Arise, and be the change you want to see in the world.

a). **We need the Holy Spirit’s help because human’s mind/heart is full of madness while we live (Eccl. 9:3b)**

b). **We need divine help to cease from the evil mankind do daily.**

c). **When the spirit of God is speaking through us. We look for solutions. Humble one’s self. And we do not create chaos.**

d) **Each of us have a responsibility to accept truth and cooperate with God.**

9. The one without sin among you, let him be first to throw a stone at you (Jn 8:7; Duet. 17:7; Ezek. 16:40)



Sin is a big problem

The Bible teaches that the wages of sin is death (Gen 3:1-7; Rom 6:23)

The Bible describes that diseases are as a result of sin. So far this is what we have seen. Sinning increase one's chance of dying early.

But Jesus did not call us to focus on sin. He wants us to minister to people's needs. When we do that do you know what will begin to happen (Isaiah 61:4) People will be led out of darkness and be healed. The world we live in, people are broken and needs a savior.

John 8:1-5 has shown us that in the mind of humans. We mark people as sinners. But Jesus does not do that. We label those we are not fond of. We will label one person a sinner based on our own appetite; to have the individual convicted and publicly shamed.


Notice that when humans speak about sin God's law is put to the back burner. Is this because of confusion of the mind? Is it because of not thinking right? Jesus in words taught them that the approach is very wrong. He modeled the truth how the law is to be applied to a person who has broken it. He provided us with show-and-tell. He let the woman participate in her case. He assessed the report and saw that the approach was flawed and bias.

IT IS NOT ABOUT FAVORITISM


- ❑ This is the show-and-tell. The image of Yeshua (Jesus) bending down and saying, "He that is without sin among you, let him first cast a stone on her." First pattern, this indicates a distribution of true justice. Number one, which of us is without sin. Number two, is this the routine? Where is the other wrongdoer? Where is the man to admit his own guilt?
- ❑ Jesus modeled the law and let the learners observe how it is to be applied. This action are the ones he is training us to do. Second pattern, notice he debriefed them, by questioning their own sinlessness. They checked themselves and realized that they were not in right standing with God either. All of them were lawbreaking citizens. Talking about being ready for change. This is it. Do self-analysis. Reflect on your own actions. Two people were caught in the act. If you choose to defend the law, then first thing, for sure, your action must be fair and be according to God's standard for the crime.
- ❑ The rule or standard God instituted of course is, (Duet 17:6) At the mouth of two witnesses, or three witnesses, shall he that is worthy of death be put to death; but at the mouth of one witness he shall not put to death. Where is the other guilty party? If the witnesses are truthful were is their guy? Jesus practice and teaches truth. And he approaches the scripture and do what it says to do. Jesus adapted the mannerism of God. The message to you is: participate in truth and apply truth to all situations. You have to practice truth. You should make those actions which Yeshua (Jesus) demonstrated your own. If Jesus is in you, let him shine. until he is shining out, he is not being represented well. Think about it!

Dear Lord Jesus,

A large group of people in the world are having difficulty exercising their faith in the face of the crisis and challenges in their personal lives. 
Why do you not understand? You are not able to give obedient hearing to my Word (Jh 8:43)

- John 8:43 declares, “why do you not understand? You are not able to give obedient hearing to my word.” Look up the word “obedient hearing,” What is “obedient hearing” _____? Please search Eerdman’s Bible Dictionary.
- The Bible tells us that Yeshua focuses on doing what the Word of God says to do. Depicting him as being obedient to death (Philip 2:8).
- His alignment with the will of God is a lesson for us. He is Jesus, and had to look to God for answers to the difficulties in His own life. What really matters is that we turn to God and we implore Him with all our hearts to help us be like our Savior. Please understand that we are united with the Messiah Yeshua. Pray to God to give us wisdom. What matters most is trusting; faithfulness; fruitfulness in you, expressing itself through love to all people. I need you to pray for my fruitfulness as well as yours.
- Sin is like a cancer; decaying the human community. Just remember what Yeshua wants is; for us to do good and help him to restore humans that are hurting. Micah 6:8; He has shown you, O man what is good. The text defines what good means as (1) to do justly, (2) to love mercy, and (3) to walk humble with your God.
- Not one of us can be good. Notice the action word is to do. We can do good to our self and to others!

All it took is : One man and one woman worldviews as the reason why we need God to be rescuing us. It took, one violent man on the earth was the cause of the flood. On the other hand, by God’s wisdom, one man was led on a piece of wood to save the world. One human almost ruin Joseph’s life had it not been for God’s wisdom that kept him free from sin. Joseph suffered because of human misleading thoughts, words and actions. These are only few lessons on differences between the forces **of good** and **the evil** ruling our thoughts and the world today.

Let us do some introspection. What is the connection of people in your circle who are harming each other? Count how many person’s you have made to feel as if they are too small to see? Unimportant? Nonfactor? Do you see a pattern of their status lowered? In what ways? Once your word and action cause a person to feel downgraded. What do you do to stop them from feeling that way? Name one way your actions made other humans move downward in life? Do you have a new direction and steps to take and improve your own life, the life of others and the world?

Now I will bring back Rahab into the discussion. I have a list of questions about her life for you.



GOD'S PURPOSE MUST BE FULFILLED IN YOUR OWN LIFE AS WELL

Why I am writing about the book of John? Are you someone appointed by God for a specific mission?

Adam was the first man God made and given a command and he disobeyed. Many of us learn the Bible from our Parents, teachers or at congregations where God calls and appoint Pastors as leaders. It is easier to learn that way. One might believe. But by me wanting to take a closer look at the book of John. During a time of fasting the Holy Spirit led me into searching for understanding...After months of discussions with God, Yeshua (Jesus) the Holy Spirit. As soon as I finished the fast! I heard the voice of Jesus loud assigned and commanded me to teach the book of John. But I was sent on a spiritual assignment overseas. Many years ago, while there someone remove from my device all notes I wrote. Of course, naturally, I became frustrated. I thought if God wanted me to write why allow the notes to be erased. My own people was used to erased the notes. But remember, we were given the privilege to choose broadly what we want to do. The unique understanding of actions and the actions results were recorded in Genesis to help us be wiser.

- ❑ The bible gives clarity so we understand "one's mind," the ears and eyes are to see and distinguish **Good** from **Evil**. The Bible also repeats at different times; several events for us to learn how to be discerning, build strategy and understanding of future activities. The explanations should help us to see the qualities or actions we should display. Throughout the Bible different tests are explained. They explain God's ideas of how we are to do good. We have been given the organs we need to function and be stable. All of these organs your eyes, ears and heart describe what is involved when a "condition of turning point" presents itself. The condition is one in which you must make a choice to do good or do evil. Most times the choice is connected to a desire such as food. Happiness. United to work on a project. Your appetite such as hunger, thirst, and emotions as desires, grief, your thoughts, love and hate and all your mental activity comes from inside of you. Thus, when an opportunity for you to make a decision is presented to you. Stop and reflect that your action: Will create change in the life of an individual; peoples and worlds!
- ❑ You are putting down your personal mark on the world. Your action can be good or evil. Your option is a personal choice.
- ❑ Your actions have a place in the public records. Thus, as we develop you have the opportunity to reflect on the changes you have brought about in the world. This raises the question and gives us something to reflect on. There is an unanswered inquiry for all of us asking why the serpent prove (or test, torment) Eve by asking hard questions! And where was Adam? Notice that her test was a simple question and the intensity was significant. All these are actions that is recorded in Genesis. A couple of answers to the questions: First, how well did Eve understand her role? Two question remains for us to consider! One, what is your perception of helper? The other question is, when provoked or challenged do you function how you are suppose to work? In other words, when you do wrong, to a person, do you experience a high degree of fearfulness? After you do the things that are wrong maybe a thought pop in your head. Do you become more upset? Then you act upon the thought to remove the provocation. Perhaps you are associated with a murderer and the person encourages you to murder your (relative) or partner that way you remove any obstacles. Maybe you would cowardly become a liar and put the blame on anyone that knows your error? **Thoughts and actions is a natural part of the life cycle. Many of us are familiar with evil wicked thoughts. We share in activities accompanied by considerable risk. Example the need for money. A sick man in critical condition. When you are to be the change that is likely to shape other individual's future. What do you do? If something or someone is set on an intentional terrorizing humans far beyond, much more than a person should be ask to bear. Should it be that you are the only witness, witnessing cruelty. What should you do_____? Be united and work together with the person tormented to help stop him/her from being grievously troubled in an unnatural terroristic manner. Do you join the terrorist? Think again about Adam and Eve. Where was Adam___? Think about what you do when you make a mistake at work? Reflect on the terroristic acts of this generation. Do you understand the lessons to learn? Yes? Or, no?**
- ❑ These things happen that we might understand the scriptures and have wise and understanding heart to apply our self and do exactly what the word of God tells us to do. Arise, go and do something to stop the chaos and care for each other.
- ❑ True, I am not John, but Jesus gave me a task. So, for each presentation of the passages in the book of John my prayer is that God's Holy Spirit add more truth in you to live a healthier life.
- ❑ Similar to some of John's rough days, where he lives in the ~~~wilderness~~~ **I can connect to his experiences distress and triumphs. Blessed be God, YHVH, Lord Yeshua he has given me the necessary authority to succeed!**

5. How many women and children are abused and you know of the molestation but choose to stay quiet?
6. How many friendships you know that are abusive and wicked but you choose to keep your mouth shut?
7. Think about your actions _____? Have you missed opportunity to help someone that is being harmed?
8. What have we missed? why would the Bible explain that Rahab was considered righteous for what she did (**James 2:25**)? Besides Sarah, do you know that this prostitute Rahab is the only woman purposely listed in the book of Hebrews? Was it only faith in the Word of God why Rahab is among the heroes of faith?
9. Two primary questions. One, why would the Bible teaches us that Rahab had faith?
